Plans are underway. Schedules are coming together. Fabulous lodging arrangements are booked. Menus are being chosen.



An Off the Body Experience

had only been working with Sonia for a few months when we had our first all Phase 6 (and 7) session. It's now been over 2 years and 100 sessions that we have been working together.

Sonia has Ehlers-Danlos Syndrome.

From the EDS website:

"The Ehlers-Danlos syndromes (EDS) are a group of hereditary disorders of connective tissue that are varied in their genetic causes, and in the ways in which they affect the body. The underlying concern is the abnormal structure or function of collagen and certain allied connective tissue proteins. They are generally characterized by joint hyper-mobility (joints that move further than normal range), joint instability (subluxation or the partial separation of the articulating surfaces of a joint), dislocations (full separation of the surfaces of a joint), scoliosis and other joint deformities, skin hyperextensibility (skin that can be stretched further than normal), abnormal scarring, and other structural weakness such as hernias and organ prolapse through the pelvic floor. In the rarer types of EDS, there may also be weakness of specific tissues that can lead, for example, to major gum and dental disease, eye disease, cardiac valve and aortic root disorders, as well as life-threatening abdominal organ, uterine, or blood vessel rupture."

Sonia has many of the sub-types of EDS. You could say she is an extreme case. So after seeing Sonia almost weekly for months, 3 weeks went by without a word. Checking in, her

mother told
me she was
having severe mast
cell reactions and
didn't want to be touched
or have any stimulus, for that
matter. Sonia would later describe the
feeling as "ants crawling under skin
and on the inside of her skull."
I suggested doing some off-body
energy work (PH6) to see if that could
help. This type of work had resulted in
some good effects during past sessions.
Sonia agreed it would be worth trying.

Sonia and I had developed a close connection from the start and our sessions were and still are very informal. We started the session with Sonia laying on a table in her living room with me next to her on the couch. I was sitting close to her at first as we sat and talked. As we connected, I had to keep moving

further out of her field, it was still too much being that close. We had been working for 10-15 minutes and I found myself standing in front of her, maybe 10 feet away, when she said emphatically something to the effect "

I wish everybody would just stop looking at me!" I thought to myself "I can do that". So I turned around, turned my palms up, arms a little out to the side and connected. Immediately, there was an explosion of energy that shot across the back of my hands and mid back simultaneously moving up and down my spine.



Sonia felt it in the same moment and asked, as she is known to do, 'What did you just do?' and I answered as I always do, "I don't know?" From there the rest of the session had me moving from points around the living room and kitchen, then outside around the front and side of the house, making connections as I went. The visual was a geodesic dome of triangles being built throughout the inside of the house. Looking back this feels more like PH7. I was finishing the session outside when her mother came home. She looked at me puzzled. Then pointed over my right shoulder. There was a blue jay sitting on the fence looking as if it was sitting on my shoulder. The blue jay is Sonia's totem animal. When we were finished, inside the change in energy was palpable. Everything felt connected. Sonia was back in her body with a feeling of wholeness and calm. Tension and pain were reduced. Crisis situation had settled down and life went on. There have been many adventures since then.

Observations of EDS

EDS seems to cause the body to contract to a point of such extremes that any movement can cause a subluxation somewhere. The internal tension and pull to center, really a torque to center, becomes so great that there's a

cascade of symptoms. The brain can become compressed from the fascia tightening to hold the body together which I believe leads to a lot of her neurasthenia symptoms. Muscles shorten beyond the length of the bone making it hard to leverage, bend and rotate leading to constant dislocation of joints. I think, and what some doctors who treat EDS have said is, that the body is contracting like this to hold itself together and function as a bi-ped. This is where, I believe, many the symptoms are derived: this constant extreme tension pattern.

What I see happening in relationship to PH6 is the organization of the energy body acting as an amniotic sac of energy to support the contraction of the physical structure which itself is also a support action. What I have found with Sonia is that sometimes her energy body gets so anchored and torqued it has to un-torque so her physical body has a place to move into. Working with Sonia is like playing a game of connect the dots. We don't stay too long with any one piece. When enough of the pieces connect, her body "reboots" and starts to organize itself structurally in what I call "Expansion Mode" becoming, once again, a functioning Tensegrity System. Read Ellen Lewis's excellent article in SOBI newsletter from October 2005.

This session was one of the most profound moments I've experienced practicing O-B. My eyes still get teary when I tell this story. Thank you to all of my teachers these past 29 years. And a big thank you to Michael Huff for sending Sonia my way and giving me a starting place to jump off from.


Ari Stein was first introduced to Ortho-Bionomy in 1993. He immediately bought the manual and

Wealthy is Healthy

hat is wealth? The origin of the word dates back to 1200-50 with the root being well or health. To take care of your self, to be whole, full and complete, to be recognized and held in a place of respect are all aspects not only of health but also of wealth. It is important for us who serve the health of others to embody and model the principles of good health in not only our personal choices but our business choices as well.

Making good choices requires understanding, a keen sense of observation, strategic planning, and honoring your limits-all principles of the work we practice daily.

When I opened my door for business as an Ortho-Bionomy practitioner, I was enthusiastic and optimistic about being in the service industry. To have the opportunity to garner wages while helping others seemed like a dream job. I priced my session work competitively in order to build my clientele based on what other therapists in the area were charging. To build my business would earn me the right to ask more for my practice. I often bartered and sometimes gave work away. I felt that I was being smart. After all, that is what everyone else in the business was doing. I was taught in massage school that if I worked hard and offered a superior skill, eventually I work. I thought this was a kind of initiation period was necessary to endure in order for me to fully "own" my space and place as a therapist-the point at which it was complete, however, was unclear and undefined.

Years went by, and it was still not unusual for me to work twelve-hour days, sometimes without stopping for lunch. I was still offering discounts for seniors and those who were financially strapped, and was still, now begrudgingly, accepting barters for paintings and jewelry I really did not need nor want. Proving that I was a good therapist was not an issue any longer; I had built a good reputation. The cash was flowing, the clients were flowing, my calendar was full, so why was I anemic, exhausted and feeling more and more unsupported at work and at home? Things were clearly out of balance, but what was the source? Did I need to eat more meat (or lunch at least) or hire a housekeeper to help out at home? Wait, I was not entirely clear whether I could even afford to hire a housekeeper... I was still charging the same rate for session work as four years ago yet my office rent has been raised twice and my taxes even more. What was this resistance to simply charging more for my work? After all, I had earned it in terms of effort, energy and expertise. The only thing that was clear to me was that I had no plan when it came to the financial aspect of my practice.

My smart CEO businessperson husband suggested that perhaps I needed to take a good hard look at my *cash flow* and see how much, if anything, I was actually making. Not just looking at cash that comes in, but also cash that goes out, and then, ultimately, what cash is left over-in other words, looking at my *profits*.

There was this sinking feeling in my stomach. When he is right, he gives me that look and slowly shakes his head, clearly chanting the unspoken mantra of "I told you so." I knew he was right. I shifted uncomfortably in my seat and protested claiming I was not trained in financial matters, could not relate to numbers, and that I did not have a clue as to how to even begin. He calmly looked toward me and said in his most wise voice, "There is no substitute for being personally involved with your own finances."

There is a simple formula that every practitioner needs to know, whether you have an accountant or not. First, we look at all of the variable costs associated with a session. These are costs that occur each time you give atypical session. For most Ortho-Bionomy practitioners, these are pretty simple. Things such as linen service, oils used for aromatherapy, candles, paperwork and give-aways such as bottled water. Next, we list the price we are charging per session. We then list all of the fixed costs associated with your practice. These would include rent, utilities, taxes, and capital expenditures such as your table and equipment. You would also want to include any continuing education costs here. There are probably more fixed costs than you would think

of right off the top of your head so take your time with this piece.

Next, you list how many sessions you anticipate giving each month. If you have employees or consider yourself an employee, you will then list salaries and benefits associated with your practice. This is where you may plan for a retirement or health care fund for yourself.

Now this is where the magic begins. Once all of the numbers have been put in place, you will be able to see exactly what your bottom line looks like. Not only will you be able to clearly see what results your past actions have produced, but also you will be able to strategically plan for the future. The idea of the reflexes in Ortho-Bionomy is to use them where responsibility is diminished. Receive this as a gentle suggestion toward on-going action and make the choice in the direction of new responsibility for your own financial success-the follow on will support you on every level of your being.
